THE WASTEGROUND (Synod follow-up)

Members of the Parish, Jesuit Community and our SJ province are discussing the future of the wasteground next to our church. Impetus for this was given by our Synod meeting in November.

Br Stephen Power SJ is chairing the panel. At the moment options include points that were raised at the Synod meeting as well as from other important parties.

I will be organizing a follow-up Synod meeting at which we can discuss the options and try to come to a clearer sense of our parish priorities for use of the land. The parish is but one of three or four different stakeholders, with the Jesuit Provincial and SJ trustees as the key decision maker. As you will appreciate the situation is extremely complex! Please pray for a good outcome.
