## PENTECOST SUNDAY/Laudato Si week

The Solemnity of Pentecost reminds us that everything which exists, every person and the whole of creation, is a gift of "God the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth." God our loving Father creates and continues to give life to the world through His Word, Jesus Christ, in the power of His Holy Spirit. The outpouring of the Holy Spirit on the Church, which we celebrate at Pentecost, is not something separate from Creation. God's revelation of himself in Creation is inseparable from the revelation of his love for us in Christ and in his desire to live in us through his Holy Spirit.

'God's Spirit is always and everywhere "the Lord, the Giver of Life", and the voice of Pentecost is echoed in the voice of creation being transformed into the glorious liberty of God's children.' In this liberty, as God's children, we call on the Spirit to 'renew the face of the Earth', and as his children, we are called, in turn, to use this liberty for the good of creation and for the good of all that brings life. Our world, God's creation, is a precious gift to us. It is our common home entrusted to each generation. But how have we used that glorious liberty? How do we honour this precious gift? Are we really demonstrating love, care and respect for our common home?

As we celebrate Pentecost this year, we are acutely aware of the damage that continues to be inflicted on the Earth, and the repercussions for the well-being of our brothers and sisters, both here in our own countries and, more especially, in the poorest countries of our

world. The late Pope Benedict XVI and Pope Francis have both taught us that everything is interconnected and interdependent. The way we live our everyday lives has an impact on everyone and on the earth. [Bishops of England and Wales] On the feast of Pentecost, Sunday, May 19, Laudato Si' Week 2024, commemorating the 9th anniversary of the publication of the encyclical Laudato Si' on the care of creation, begins. It will last until Sunday, May 26, and announces (as in previous years) Pope Francis' message for the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation, September 1, the beginning of the Season of Creation. Convinced along with Pope Francis that "there are no lasting changes without cultural changes... and there are no cultural changes without personal changes" (LD 70), Catholics around the world may join in daily challenges that motivate changes in personal habits, and gradually transform societies.

The theme of this year's Laudato Si' Week is inspired by the Season of Creation 2024 symbol, "the firstfruits of hope". Hope is an instrument that enables us to overcome the natural law of decadence; only through it can we realize the gift of freedom in its fullness.
