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Love God and Love neighbour

When we experience God's love for us, the love is so powerful that it flows from us back to God, but also increases our love for others. In the Gospel for today Jesus quotes the *Shema*, Israel's great affirmation of faith and love of God. One imagines that the words come quickly to Jesus' lips because, as a devout Jew, he would have prayed the prayer each morning and evening, "Hear, O Israel! The Lord is our God, the Lord alone!"

Jesus speaks in the spirit of the Torah, and confesses that love of God is our primary desire and goal. And, along with our Jewish brothers and sisters, we are called to love and worship God with "all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength."

One of the truths of Christianity that is sometimes forgotten is that love is more important than just about anything, and certainly more important than rituals. In fact, for St Paul, ritual is empty and worthless without love. If we continue to harbour resentment in our hearts, we would be better off seeking to be free of those things than practising religion. So all the commandments boil down to just those two: Love God and Love your neighbour.

Today Jesus invites us to see that we are to love God totally -- all of our heart, soul, mind and strength. And living in that love, we are to love ourselves and one another. Nothing is greater than this embracing love. To teach our young ones about God who loves us is the greatest gift we can leave them.

We are also expected to love our neighbour. This is where Jesus goes much deeper in his teaching and in a more radical way, than the faithful members of his Jewish audience were willing to accept easily. He

deliberately will use the example of the Good Samaritan (the people of Samaria were Israel's nearest neighbours and there was a long history of enmity between them) to emphasise the radical nature of his teaching. The tragedy of the wars in the Middle East and in Ukraine represent a horrendous failure to understand the truth of Jesus' teaching about God and our neighbour.

Lutheran Pastor, Dietrich Bonhoeffer, who was put to death in 1945 by the Nazis, put it like this:

"Every moment and every situation challenges us to action and to obedience. We have literally no time to sit down and ask ourselves whether so-and-so is our neighbour or not. We must get into action and obey—we must behave like a neighbour to him."
