## MESSAGE FROM JESUIT NOVICE Fr. Ján Mahút

(with us for six weeks in October/November)

On Sunday evening, October 6th, I arrived at St. Ignatius Church for the first time and joined the Jesuit community. The next day, I met Father Andrew to discuss my time in Stamford Hill, and on that very day, I began serving in the Social Apostolate to the poor and homeless. In the first two weeks, I asked myself: What does it mean for these people to be in the parish? Do their prayer groups help them grow spiritually? Is the Social Apostolate effective in supporting people in need? Are these people being transformed? I felt dissatisfied. Several things helped me change my perspective.

I remember one evening when I returned to the Jesuit community feeling disappointed, one of my brothers helped me see what people truly needed. Another thing that changed my point of view was the Jesuit community's openness and willingness to share. It made me more interested in the brothers in the community.

Then, there was the experience in the Social Apostolate. One man from the "People in Need" group told me that I was hiding something behind my mask. I was taken aback, but his words made me reflect on myself. During my time in the Social Apostolate, I also experienced much love and laughter among the volunteers. This showed me that we are there for people, with open arms, as God would have us be. At that time, I was reading a book about priestly fatherhood, which encouraged me to bring people to prayer before God. Prayer opened my heart and inspired me to share my weaknesses, helping me grow closer to others. Priestly ministry was also significant for me. I had the opportunity to deepen my relationship with Christ and accompany people in their personal stories, as well as in their reconciliation with the Lord.

Responsorial Psalm: What great deeds the Lord worked for us! Indeed we were glad.

Another experience also changed my perspective. I was asked to preach to the children at the Polish Mass for children. I thought it would be easy, since my mother tongue is similar to Polish. However, I quickly realized that it wasn't as simple as I had thought. It was humbling but also healing.

After these experiences, I began to ask myself: What does it mean for me to be here? I realized that we are here to be an image of God's love, to represent His Kingdom. I felt grateful that in the parish, I could be with people who praise God in their own way, as both a brother and a spiritual father. I became more thankful for the love and service of my brothers in the Jesuit community.

Finally, I began to understand the purpose of the work in the parish, especially in the Social Apostolate. As a volunteers, we were there to accept people as they are and with God's love to help them take the next steps on their journey.

Dear St Ignatius Parish and the Jesuit community in Stamford Hill, Thank you for allowing me to be among you!

Thank you for your love, faith, and hope.

With God's grace you helped me be challenged, transformed, and more open-hearted.

I am keeping you in my prayers. Please keep me in yours as well. I hope to meet you again. With many blessings as we prepare for Christmas, Jan
