BAPTISM OF THE LORD

"The Holy Spirit descended on Jesus in bodily form, like a dove; and a voice came from heaven, 'You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased."

That Spirit that empowered Jesus to make his new beginning is the same Spirit that empowered us in ours. Few of us can remember that moment; most of us were carried to the font, infants in the arms of our parents or godparents.

Our name was given to us, our commitment was spoken for us, our future was promised to God. We spend our lives catching up with our beginning, struggling to make good the large promises made on our behalf.

JUBILEE: Pilgrims of Hope

In accordance with an ancient tradition, the Pope proclaims a Holy Year, a Jubilee, every twenty-five years. This special Holy Year began on Christmas Eve and ends at Epiphany in 2026. It is, in essence, the Church offering a year of hope, especially for those living on the margins.

In the Old Testament the Jubilee was a time to re-establish a proper relationship with God, to be marked every 50 years by the forgiveness of debts, the liberation of slaves or and prisoners, and the return of land and property to its rightful owners.

The Jubilee offers us a special new year, a fresh start, an opportunity to change direction; it is a call for Christians to play our part, as Pope Francis declares, "to be tangible

signs of hope for those of our brothers and sisters who experience hardships of any kind". We must take to heart the need to "bear credible and attractive witness to the faith and love that dwell in our hearts; that our faith may be joyful and our charity enthusiastic; and that each of us may be able to offer a smile, a small gesture of friendship, a kind look, a ready ear, a good deed, in the knowledge that, in the Spirit of Jesus, these can become, for those who receive them, rich seeds of hope".
