APPEAL FOR JESUIT MISSIONS



We welcome Richard Solly, campaigns officer
for Jesuit Missions, who will speak at all
Masses this weekend. Jesuit Missions is the
main agency for the British Province of the
Jesuits supporting charitable work and

advocacy in the poorest and most deprived parts of the world. We
support Jesuit projects in different communities around the world,
especially in Africa and Asia. Jesuit Missions is part of a Jesuit Network
call the Xavier Network. This allows us to join with other Jesuit
development organisations to support bigger projects and to respond
quickly to emergencies caused by war and natural disasters, such as
the current refugee crisis in South Sudan.

Laura, the projects officer, who made the appeal here last year, visited
Zambia and Zimbabwe where we currently support two educational
projects. These provide services for children and young people to
enable them to stay in school. Many countries lack the financial
resources to provide universal education, and parents have to pay for
secondary education. This is a luxury that few can afford. Often, young
people need to earn wages to support families, and are not in a
position to complete school.

Richard's own work as Campaigns and Advocacy officer is to find ways
of tackling the underlying problems which create or worsen the needs
which our partners around the world are addressing. One massive
problem which affects all our partners is climate change. It creates
huge difficulties for rural communities living by farming, because of

changing weather patterns making the whole agricultural cycle unpredictable.

We support projects helping farming communities adapt by adopting new planting practices. But we also support partners who are trying to get the world's governments to adopt the policies necessary to combat climate change.
