Ss. Peter and Paul

Simon Peter was really very human. He fished for his living, he could be compulsive, he turned his back on Jesus and said he didn't know him. After Pentecost Peter gave himself wholeheartedly for the task of preaching the message of Christ. What about Paul? He hunted down and persecuted Christians. After his sudden conversion, he made long and difficult journeys: no place was too distant for his missionary zeal. The message from these two pillars of the Church is (1) God chooses ordinary people to do his work; they make mistakes, they can be aggressive, bullies, liars, but somehow God finds a way through. (2) The fact that Paul became a Christian in the first place and preached the good news so well shows us that when the time of conversion comes, whether it is sudden as in the case of Paul, or a slow gradual, still small voice in our private conscience, God's forgiveness is overwhelming: even if we have been hunting Christians down and putting them to death, the gift of faith in Christ brings with it the forgiveness of God that overwhelms all past sin and guilt. The church itself seems to have inherited the characteristics of Peter and Paul, good and bad; and for a very good reason: just like Jesus Christ himself, the church is both human and divine. Small wonder, then, that the church sometimes seems to make decisions that make us angry or resentful. We all know that the human faces around us in today's society are capable of acts of selfishness, bitterness and even hatred. but the great good that is shown in our acts of forgiveness, of healing and of love, show us the still stronger human side that is also so much a part of the Church.

For the late Pope Francis, St. Peter and St. Paul "served the Lord in very different ways. Yet in their diversity, both bore witness to the merciful love of God our Father, which each in his own fashion profoundly

experienced, even to the sacrifice of his own life." "For this reason, from very ancient times the Church in the East and in the West combined in one celebration the commemoration of the martyrdom of Peter and Paul. It is right to celebrate together their self-sacrifice for love of the Lord, for it is at the same time a commemoration of unity and diversity."
