MOST HOLY TRINITY

Our God is so much part of the life of the Church that at the beginning early church leaders and teachers were very careful about what they said about God. They didn't want to make mistakes, and it took about 300 years to develop the teaching that God is Father, Son and Holy Spirit— not three Gods with different names, but one God in three persons; three different aspects of the same God.

The book of Proverbs gives us a description of a very ancient understanding of who God is: an unseen and unknown power of wisdom, in existence back before the dawn of time itself. This was the beginning the way the people of Israel began to know who God is. For them God was an incredible force of power and of protection, of love and of strength.

It is in Jesus Christ that God finally has a name, a face, a body, and a human life. Right from the moment of the birth of Christ, Christians can say that we know God. And we know more about God because of the Gospels, because of the teachings and writings of the early church, because of the way in which the Holy Spirit, sent to the Church at the first Pentecost, continues to lead us and guide us.

In the Gospel today we hear how Jesus promises that the Spirit of God will come and explain who God is to the disciples, and will help them to carry on the work that Jesus began.

Today's feast reminds us that God is truly present within us. If there is anything at all that separates us from the love of God or from the Church, we pray for the healing power of the spirit to draw us back. God understands what it means to be human, God loves us and forgives us. God understands what it means to be in a living and loving relationship, God helps us in our loneliness and doubt and fear, and brings us to a place and a community where we belong. We pray to God,

Responsorial Psalm: O Lord, our Lord, how majestic is your name through all the earth!

Father Son and Spirit, to fill us with the graces and blessings that we need to draw us closer to God and to one another.
