Today is Sea Sunday, when we pray for all who work on the sea. There will be a retiring collection for the Apostleship of the Sea, supporting the chaplains who work on the sea.

Sea Sunday is an opportunity for us to remember and say prayers for all the brave men and women who work at sea to make sure we have all that we need. Join us to celebrate Sea Sunday and raise funds which help to provide essential support and services for seafarers who often work in dangerous and lonely conditions. We might not realise it, but we all depend on seafarers. 90% of everything we use, from food and medication to cars and household furnishings, reaches us via the sea.

Your support for The Mission to Seafarers enables us to care for the shipping industry's greatest assets: its people. Being a seafarer is tough. Crews can spend months away working long hours with little respite or contact with home.

On top of the daily pressures, the threat of piracy, shipwreck and abandonment are ever present for the men and women who serve us at sea. This challenging job has become even harder. Increased restrictions and lockdowns implemented during the COVID-19 pandemic saw many seafarers working beyond their contract end, and unfortunately, these restrictions continue to impact shore leave today.

Most recently, attacks and threats to ships traversing the Red Sea have added to the plight of seafarers. Amid these challenges, The Mission to Seafarers has been a constant source of practical support and reassurance. Through our teams in 200 ports, the Apostleship of the Sea has been supporting the 1.89 million unseen keyworkers who have /
