Eucharist: Food for the soul

Jesus reminds the ones at the table of the importance of taking care of "the poor, the crippled, the lame, and the blind."

We remember that Jesus was criticised for sitting at table with sinners, the sick, tax collectors and the disreputable -- people who would be shunned from the tables of the Pharisees, and who would have a hard time talking their way into the synagogue as well. In the Gospel scene today, Jesus as usual is aware that he is with people who have strongly negative views about him, and that they are watching him for the slightest slip or mistake that they might be able to use against him, in order to ruin his reputation or to find ways to accuse him before the Roman authorities.

But Jesus is able to move between both worlds; that of the sinner and that of the Pharisee, because he knows that they are all creatures of the one loving God, and are all expected to follow the rule of love and forgiveness.

The experience of the celebration of Mass should be one that in some way mirrors what Jesus is speaking of today. He asks us to invite sinners into this place to pray with us and to receive forgiveness. He offers himself in his body and blood to heal us, to renew our faith, to bring peace, and to be reconciled with God and with one another. This is food for the soul that we receive today. We are expected not to sit in judgement on other people in the congregation, and therefore not to behave like the Pharisees, but to realise that we are all united in one faith, and on our own journeys towards consolation, healing and peace.

Let us pray for one another at Mass and during the coming week.

Responsorial Psalm: In your goodness, or God, you provide a home for the poor.
