Dedication of the Lateran Basilica/Remembrance Sunday

St. John Lateran in Rome is our "mother church". It is the Pope's parish church, the cathedral of Rome. Many centuries ago the pope used to have important councils at St. John Lateran. It is a building that is part of our tradition, and we are connected to it because we are connected to the Pope. As St. John Lateran is many centuries old, it needs constant care and attention. But it is not the structure that Christ built. That is made up of living stones; the people of God who are gathered into his body. We are God's temple, built by Christ himself. We are in constant need of rebuilding. Christ gives us the gifts we need to maintain this living temple.

And on Remembrance Sunday we acknowledge that the living body of the Church needs particular care: to prevent war and destruction, to maintain peace and harmony, to provide comfort for all those who are injured, or who have lost loved ones. Ezekiel warned his people of the terrible outcome of their lack of repentance: the destruction of their temple and of their people because of war. He promised the people that there would be a new temple to bring hope and healing, with rivers of flowing water bringing life and renewal. A place where "peace is flowing like a river".

In the Gospel Jesus reminds people who the real temple is. He is the one who becomes the Passover victim himself. It is the death of Jesus on the cross that frees us from the slavery of sin, and from the finality of death. It is Christ himself whose death brings all of us

true freedom and peace. We need to find Christ again, not in the building that is made of stone, but in the real temple, in his living Body, made up of all the living here and now.

On this Remembrance Sunday we must pray for peace in the world. Pope Saint John Paul II preached movingly on this theme when he visited Coventry in 1982: "Peace is not just the absence of war. It involves mutual respect and confidence between peoples and nations. It involves collaboration and binding agreements. Like a cathedral, peace has to be constructed, patiently and with unshakeable faith." May peace flow like a river from our churches.
