## 2nd Sunday of Advent: Repent, for the Kingdom of God is at hand

John the Baptist grabbed everyone's attention with his message about what was going to happen to everyone. All the Gospels mention him at the beginning because he is the link between every-thing that happened before the time of Jesus, especially the Old Testament prophets, and the time of Jesus himself and afterwards: the New Testament. John the Baptist is the man standing at the end of the entire history of the people of God, from Creation onwards, and he gives a terrifying account to people who listen to him. "His winnowing fork is in his hand and he will clear his threshing floor and gather his wheat into the barn; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."

The teaching of John the Baptist gives a clear message to all of us as we prepare for the coming of the Lord. John doesn't preach at the centre of power in Jerusalem. He's out on the fringe, on the edge. Those in the centre are leaving homes, jobs and their communities to come out to hear him. They move out to the edges to hear the Word of God.

Advent is our chance to make space in our lives; to leave our centre of comfort and routine and find somewhere to hear what God has to say to us. In "Evangelii Gaudium" (the "Joy of the Gospel"), Pope Francis wrote, "I do not want a church concerned with being at the centre and then ends by being caught up in a web of obsessions and procedures."

We must take a good look at the way we live our lives.

The prophecy of Isaiah is that there is a better world on the way; a world where justice and peace are lived realities, where people once at war are at peace, where the forces of mankind and of nature are at peace. It would be a great mistake for us to be complaisant - to think that if we wait that world will come. But as Christians who live with the Gospel in our hearts, we are committed to living out of the message of Jesus in every moment of our daily lives.

Responsorial Psalm: In his days justice shall flourish, and great peace for ever.

Today we pray for the young people in our parish who are beginning their course towards the sacrament of Confirmation. May the Holy Spirit continue to inspire them and bring them joy on their journey of faith.



Let us pray that Christians living in areas of war or conflict, especially in the Middle East, might be seeds of peace, reconciliation, and hope.
