Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

Today's Feast of the Holy Trinity, contemplates the deepest mystery of our faith: that God is One, yet Three: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. This is not simply a puzzle for theologians to solve but a mystery and a truth to be lived. In today's Gospel, we hear those beautiful and familiar words: "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son." Here we glimpse the heart of the Trinity: the Father who loves, the Son who is given for our salvation, and the Spirit through whom that divine love is poured into our hearts. The Trinity reveals that at the centre of all reality

is not isolation, but communion; not self-interest, but self-giving love.

This speaks powerfully to our own moment. In his recent encyclical on artificial intelligence, *Magnifica Humanitas*, Pope Leo reminds us that while technology offers great possibilities, it must always remain at the service of the human person and never weaken our capacity for authentic relationship. In an age increasingly shaped by machines, the Holy Father calls us back to what is most deeply human: our vocation to love, to communion, and to encounter. His message then is profoundly Trinitarian. No machine, however advanced, can replicate the mystery of self-giving love that reflects the very life of God. The Trinity teaches us that to be fully human is not simply to become more efficient or more connected digitally, but to grow in love, truth and communion with God and one another.

As we celebrate this feast, may our parish become ever more a living sign of that divine communion. And each time we make the Sign of the Cross, may we do so thoughtfully and gratefully, remembering that we place ourselves in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit — the God who creates us, redeems us, and remains with us always.

SACRISTAN—RECRUITING

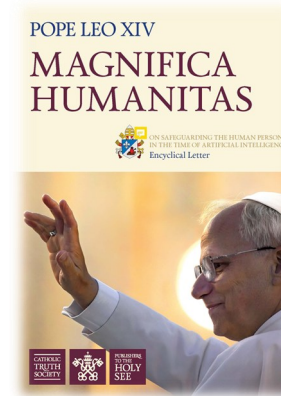

Registration for the walk begins next Sunday after all Masses. The entry fee is £10. A retiring collection will also be taken after the Masses to support the parish's work with the homeless.

Magnifica Humanitas: on safeguarding the human person in the time of artificial intelligence

On Wednesday, Pope Leo issued his first encyclical. With it, he steps into one of the defining debates of our age: artificial intelligence. The document asks a simple but urgent question: will technology serve humanity or control it? Pope Leo insists that AI can be a force for good. But he warns that technology is never truly "neutral." It reflects the values of those who build, fund and use it. If left in the hands of a powerful few, AI risks widening inequality, undermining truth, exploiting workers and reducing people to data points rather than children of God. Pope Leo calls for ethical safeguards, public accountability and international cooperation so that AI serves the common good instead of profit or power. He speaks about protecting the dignity of work, defending migrants and vulnerable communities, safeguarding peace, and resisting a culture where efficiency matters more than compassion. He reminds us that the human heart, not technology, must remain at the centre of society.
